SCRANTON, Penn., Sept. 18.—M. J. Quinn, Superintendent of the Minooka Colliery, owned by his brother, P. F. Quinn, was killed to-day, and two miners, James Price and William Moors, were badly injured by a fall of the roof. They were "robbing pillars" in a vein only ten feet below the surface when the roof caved in.
