

## NOTTINGHAM MINE FLOODED.

PLYMOUTH, Penn., April 4.—The Nottingham mine of the Lehigh and Wilkesbarre Coal Company, having a greater output than any other colliery in the anthracite regions, is flooded, and will probably remain so for many months. The trouble began on Thursday last, and the water rose so rapidly that on Saturday all the large pumps inside were drowned and stopped.

An attempt was made to lower the flood by hauling the water up the shaft in huge buckets on the cages, but it is still rising. The lower lifts of the slope are under water, as is also the foot of the shaft, and nothing can be done to stay the flooding.

The trouble is supposed to arise from the leaking through of water from the Susquehanna River, which is very high and under a part of which the slope extends.
