"Gross freight revenue" means respondent's gross revenue from freight without adjustment for absorptions or corrections

Class 950, "Forwarder Traffic (C. L.)," includes freight traffic in carloads shipped by or consigned to any forwarder holding a certificate under Part IV of the Interstate Commerce Act.

In the note on page 519C show the aggregate of the gross charges for protective services to perishable freight (without deduction for any proportion thereof credited to account No. 101, "Freight"). The carrier on whose rails protective service to perishable freight originates, or to which the charges are credited, will report the gross tariff charges for such services. Tariff charges for specific services performed at origin, in transit, or at destination, which are not included in the established (standard) charges from the point at which the protective service was first applicable, and which are collected from shippers or consignees, should be reported by the carrier to which such charges accrue.
