FIRE-DAMP IN A MINE.

WILKESBARRE, Penn., Dec. 20.—The air course being cut off in the Pine Ridge Colliery by the recent cave-in, has forced an accumulation of fire-damp in the mine to such an extent that it is impracticable for the miners to venture more than a few yards from the foot of the shaft into the mine. It is impossible to trace the cavein or to ascertain the course of the foul air. Four hundred men are thrown out of employment for weeks by this forced suspension.
