

HIS SKULL SPLIT WITH AN AXE.

SCRANTON, Penn., Dec. 4.—During a quarrel which occurred to-day between two laborers at Spencer's mine, Dunmore, near this city, Jack Early struck his antagonist, ANTONIO Murrani, on the head with an axe and split his skull. It was reported at first that the wounded man had been killed, and great excitement prevailed among his friends. He rallied after a short time, and the doctor thinks he may recover. Early has been arrested and placed in the county jail.
